


1St HOUR

Give students the camping journal cover and have them color it as students come in and put their backpacks away and get ready in he day. To start the say give tradents the camping sign page page 1 f the journal. Have stude ts nake up a name for their camp and write a description of why camp reshould visit their camp. When students mish, give them the me rescription page (with the cloud, sulcase and mountains) Have students rite/draw the answer to the questions in de the picture.

Decorate the sign to show the name of the camp your teacher is visiting. Then write a note telling people to come to this camp!





2nd Hour=

Give students the camp map. Read these direction to the students and have them draw a path to the wyler directions:

Start at the star. Go Northwest and write your lest spelling word on the lake. From the lake, go East until you come to the hills. Write you second coelling word between the hills. From the hills, go Southwest and write your 3rd spelling list on the river. Now, go Southeast until you make here the valley. Your fourth spelling word goest iere. After that, go southwest to the field. Write your 5th spelling word in the field. From the field go southeast to the canyon. Write your any pelling word in the canyon. Finally, go southwest until ou make it to the desert. You have arrived at your destination! Write your 7th spelling word here.


Students may color the map, then use the map to write their own directions for how to get to their camp site. First they will have to choose one of the landforms to use as their camp ground, then start at the star and write directions from there. They may need you to model this.

3RD HOUR =

Read students a book about camping, or about something you may see while camping (s'n bears, birds, forests, campfires) The keek ca non fiction or fiction and can be out any bill that can tie back to camping. A er the book, tak with students about what it ould be like to go camping. What would we see. Make st of things that students come up with Give students the A – Z list parer, and have them come up with one item for each letter of at they might see, need, or use we're camping. Once their list is commete, ave sudents fill the picture of the back classification drawing the items inside. After stuent. Sinish have them read their library books in **7** 'tent' under their desks). Remember that udents need to hang on to all of these papers in or to put together their journal at the end of the day.



4th Hour =

students will make a weather forecast for their camp. Give them the weather forecast page and help them give a forecast for 4 days. Write in following words on the board to help them

Partly Cloudy
Rainy
Thunderstorm
Snowy
Cloudy

Regard Sudent that their temperatures should mater the anditions. Ex: snowy should have cold temperatures, sunny may have warm temps. Sudents may need help determining temperatures. Students will write a description for the temperature for each day. If students finish early they may read under their desks again.

A trapezoid on bottom and a triangle for on top.


A peak like this makes a good camping stop. With snow on top you can ski down the side. Or just camp out at the bottom if you aren't up for the ride.



If the campers already have \$80, how much more money do they need? What bills can they use to make this amount?


6th Hour







You can use this work if you need any extra time fillers. Just have students add these worksheets to their journals. Also, if need be you can choose any book to react aloud to the students!


